Andrew Meadows is Professor of Ancient History, Tutorial Fellow, New College, Oxford; Director, Centre for the Study of Ancient Documents, University of Oxford

He obtained a MA, Literae Humaniores, University of Oxford; AM, Classical Philology, University of Michigan; DPhil, Ancient History, University of Oxford.

Andrew Meadows is a specialist in the history, numismatics and epigraphy of the Hellenistic Greek world. From 1995-2007 he was Curator of Greek Coins at the British Museum, in 2007 he became Margaret Thompson Curator of Greek Coins at the American Numismatic Society. From 2008-2014 he was Deputy Director of

the Society. In 2014 he moved to Oxford to take up a Professorship and the Tutorial Fellowship in Ancient History at New College. In October of 2014 he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the American Numismatic Society. In October 2018 he was appointed Director of the Centre for the Study of Ancient Documents at the University of Oxford.

From 1998-2006 he was Secretary of the British Academy's Sylloge Nummorum Graecorum Committee, and in 2013 he was appointed Director of the international SNG project. From 2002-2005 he served as Honorary Secretary of the Royal Numismatic Society. In 2007 he was a Member of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton. In 2012 he was elected to the Kraay Visitorship at Wolfson College and a Robinson Visiting Scholarship in the Heberden Coin Room of the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford. In 2014/5 he was the Archaeological Institute of America's Metcalf Lecturer. In July 2015 he was elected to an Honorary Curatorship of the Ashmolean Museum, and in September 2015 as a member of the International Numismatic Council.

Prof. Meadows was co-curator of the HSBC Money Gallery at the British Museum and has curated and contributed to a number of temporary exhibitions, including Earlier Monetary Unions, From Alexander to Mark Antony: Images of Power on Ancient Coins and Brief Lives. The Changing Currencies of Western Europe (at the British Museum), History Re-stored: Ancient Greek Coins from the Zhuyuetang Collection (at the Hong Kong Museum of History), and the traveling exhibitions Cleopatra of Egypt: From History to Myth and Forgotten Empire: The World of Ancient Persia.

He has written and edited more than 120 books and articles, including three volumes in the Sylloge Nummorum Graecorum series and Coin Hoards IX and X. He is Series Editor of the joint ANS-Cambridge University Press Guides to the Coinage of the Ancient World, co-editor of the Oxford Studies in Ancient Documents Series. He is currently finishing a book-length study of the development of civic coinage in Hellenistic Asia Minor.

He is PI and co-director of Online Coins of the Roman Empire (OCRE), is currently working on a collaborative project to digitise the Inventory of Greek Coin Hoards and is co-founder and a



member of the steering committee of the Nomisma project. He is also working with a group of colleagues to establish a project to develop Linked Open Data standards for Greek numismatics (Online Greek Coinage).

Prof. Meadows has also taught Greek and Roman numismatics for the Summer Seminar of the American Numismatic Society and as an Adjunct Professor for Columbia University in New York. He as worked on excavation coins from the site of Kinik Höyük in Turkey and is working with the Institut Européen d'Archéologie Sous-Marine and the Oxford Centre for Maritime Archaeology on the publication of material from the excavations at Herakleion, East Canopus and Alexandria in Egypt.
