STUDIES

Leonidas F. Kallivretakis was born in Canea (island of Crete) in 1953. He graduated from the History and Archaeology Dept (Faculty of Philosophy of the University of Athens) in 1977 and he continued his post-graduate studies in Paris, orientated to the social and economic history, the political history of the Balkans and the history of consciences (Université de Paris-Sorbonne, Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes), while teaching Modern Greek Language, History and Civilization in the Institut d'Etudes Néohelléniques de Paris. In 1978 he obtained his Maitrise, in 1979 his Diplôme d' Etudes Approfondies and in 1983 he successfully submitted his Doctorate thesis entitled *Gustave Flourens (1838-1871) et la Grèce* (Université de Paris-Sorbonne).

PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY

During his post-graduate studies, he taught Modern Greek Language, History and Civilization in the Institut d'Etudes Néohelléniques de Paris (1979-1981). After accomplishing his military service, he taught Modern and Contemporary Greek History in the public Post-Lyceum Centers of Athens (1985-1988).

Since 1988 he has been affiliated with the National Hellenic Research Foundation, elected Director of Research in 2001. He has been a member of the Scientific Council of the Institute of Neohellenic Research (2002-2011) and subsequently served as its last Acting Director (2011-2012), before the latter was merged to the Institute of Historical Research. He has also been an elected member of the Administrative Board of the NHRF (2003-2016).

He speaks and writes in Greek, French and English.
